Montessori Math Lesson: Introduction to Numbers (1-10)

Age Group: 3-year-olds

Materials:

- Montessori Sandpaper Numbers (1-10)
- Small tray with fine sand or a sandpaper board
- Counting objects (e.g., small wooden beads, buttons, or pom-poms)
- A work mat

Objectives:

- Introduce numbers 1-10 using a multisensory approach.
- Help children associate number symbols with their spoken names.
- Develop fine motor skills through tracing and counting.
- Lay the foundation for numerical order and one-to-one correspondence.



Lesson Presentation: Montessori Three-Period Lesson

Step 1: Naming the Numbers (Introduction)

- 1. Invite the child to the work area and introduce the Sandpaper Numbers.
- 2. Pick up the number "1" and say, "This is one." Trace the number with two fingers while saying its name. Encourage the child to do the same.
- 3. Repeat the process for numbers 2 and 3 (limit the introduction to three numbers at a time).

Step 2: Recognizing the Numbers (Association)

- 1. Place the three introduced numbers in front of the child.
- 2. Say, "Point to one," "Point to two," or "Point to three."
- 3. Ask the child to trace the number while saying its name.

Step 3: Recalling the Numbers (Recall)

- 1. Hold up a number and ask, "What number is this?"
- 2. If the child answers correctly, introduce the next numbers. If they struggle, repeat the previous steps.



Extension Activity: Counting with Objects

- 1. Place counting objects (e.g., small beads) next to each Sandpaper Number.
- 2. Ask the child to count out the same number of objects as shown on the number card.
- 3. Reinforce one-to-one correspondence by having the child touch each object while counting aloud.

Control of Error:

- The tactile nature of Sandpaper Numbers guides proper number formation.
- Self-correction occurs as the child matches numbers with the corresponding quantity.
